1.		<p>(i) As desired by NVBDCP, Delhi, requested State Program Officer (Malaria) to submit epidemiological report of Dengue and Chikungunya cases pending since January 2010, as the reports are essential to monitor the situation at National level.</p> <p>(ii) As intimated by Director, NVBDCP, Delhi, requested State Program Officer Malaria to provide details of expired stock and near expiry stock of insecticides lying at the PHC, CHC, District and State level in the specified format of the NVBDCP, Delhi.</p> <p>(iii) As desired by NVBDCP, Delhi requested State Program Officer (Malaria) to send entomological data for change of insecticide in the State as the information regarding 3 years susceptibility date of Malaria vectors of the State was not received in the NVBDCP HQ.</p> <p>(iv) The information received from NVBDCP, Delhi regarding hiring of a professional agency i.e. M/s Strategic Alliance Management Services, New Delhi in managing the Logistics and Supply Chain of drugs, insecticides, larvicides, diagnostic kits and LLINs etc. has been communicated to State Program Officer (Malaria). The agency will also ensure their uninterrupted availability in the State/district and sub-district level. The agency will also carry out training and capacity building of key personnel involved in supply chain management and logistics at various levels in the states supported under the World Bank Project.</p> <p>(v) As informed by NVBDCP, Delhi advised State VBD officials to participate in the Kalyani Program in Doordarshan and provide technical inputs time to time to strengthen the program.</p> <p>(vi) The State TB Officer has been intimated about the observation and recommendation regarding Drug Logistics Management in the State and has advised to organise training and re-training for all concerned officials engaged in drug management.</p> <p>(vii) As desired by NVBDCP, Delhi requested State Program Officer (Malaria) to intimate the consolidated status of up-scaling of larvivorous fish on monthly basis on Priority basis.</p> <p>(viii) As desired by Director, CBHI, requested Director of Health Services, Chhattisgarh to intimate complete details of Private Health Care Institute establishment in the State as the information earlier sent by the State was found incomplete the same could not be accommodated in the National Health Profile-2010.</p> <p>Total : 8</p>
