i.	ECs Under gone sterilization Operations	08	Out of 12 permanent sterilization clients, 8 were traced and interviewed in the field area. Out of total traced, one case resulted in sterilization failure after procedure (12/10/2011). 7 Clients were satisfied with the service provided by the health institute and staff.
ii.	ECs consuming Oral pills as CC Methods	03	06 oral pills clients were selected from 1 HSC, of which 3 were traced in field. 1 client was found fake . Two sub centers are not getting supply of OC pill since last two years.
iii.	ECs have got IUDs inserted	02	2 IUD users were contacted out of 3 selected. Team found both the cases fake. HMIS report having more number of clients.
iv.	ECs practicing Barrier methods (condom)	03	5 condom users were selected for verification, 3 were visited in the field. Out of three, two were fake clients . It seems that cases reported to HIMS are fake and need to be verified. Two sub-centers are not getting supply of condom since last two years (Jilda and Nawgoi). Mothers are checked as per trimester. The awareness among the mother needs improvement related to the Colostrums, ARI, Family Planning and immunization etc in all surveyed HSCs. Out of 17 mothers, 13 mothers are not satisfied with ASHA services.
ii.	INC cases Field verified	17	Out of 13 surveyed mothers, 15 were undergone institutional delivery and 2 home deliveries. No complication noted among the mothers.
